GENERAL TOPICS AND PROJECT AREA

Since the archaeological spaces in urban marginal contexts are often in conditions of isolation and they are mostly unknown or not adequately shown, the workshop goal is to investigate the topic of the unveiling of the ruins in urban spaces. The topic will be addressed through a strategic vision that aims at overcoming the logic of the archaeological enclave, in order to transform spaces, materials, figures, which are part of the archaeological area into new possible places of urban inclusion, always considering the need for safeguard and enhancement of the ruins. The contemporary architectural project becomes a process of discovery of values already existing in context and waiting only to be found. To reason on this issue, the case study of the widespread ruins in the landscape of Pianura between Neapolis and Puteoli is considered, that is an urban district located in the western part of Naples, where the valorization of the spaces of the different remains placed along via Montagna Spaccata can play a significant role in processes of social and urban regeneration. In this archaeological area, it is possible to experiment design devices that can establish new relationships between the spread ruins and the neighboring context, in a vital urban dynamic, also offering a development orientation for unfinished spaces, neighboring isolated architectures and real places of waste. In this framework, the main topics are: the issues of urban accessibility to the archaeological sites; the connection between the different archaeological ruins along via Montagna Spaccata; the redefinition of the open spaces in relation to the ruins; the improvement of the perception of the ruins into the landscape and the social inclusion.
